### Ajax

- Updated application deadline for 2022 Municipal Election: 90 days after the candidate's financial filing deadline

### Markham

- Rebate formula (applies to total contributions during an election):

Total Contribution	Rebate
\$50 – \$300	75% of contribution
\$301 – \$550	\$225 + 50% of contribution amount in excess of \$300
\$551 and over	\$350

- Of 69 candidates to register, only **65** (88%) met the program requirements

### Mississauga

- If a contributor donates a total of \$25 or more to multiple campaigns but no individual contribution is over \$25, no rebate will be issued

### Oakville

- Candidates and their family members are excluded from rebate eligibility
  - 'Family member' means a parent, spouse, or child as defined in the *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act*, and also includes a grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew or niece (blood, marriage, or adoption)
- Of the Town's Council of 15, one office was acclaimed and the candidate did not use the rebate program

## Ontario Municipal Election Contribution Rebate Programs (2018 Municipal Election)

---

### Ottawa

- Rebate formula (applies to total contributions during an election):

Total Contribution	Rebate
\$25.01 – \$100	50% of contribution
\$100.01 – \$200	\$50 + 25% of contribution amount in excess of \$100.01

- Participating candidates who withdraw their nomination are entitled to a rebate of 75% to a maximum of \$900.00 for personal contributions to their campaign
- Of 103 candidates to register, only **51** (49%) met the program requirements

### Toronto

- Rebate formula (applies to total contributions during an election):

Total Contribution	Rebate
\$25.01 – \$300	75% of contribution
\$300.01 – \$1,000	\$300 + 50% of contribution amount in excess of \$300
\$1,000.01 and over	\$575 + 33 <sup>1/3</sup> % of contribution amount in excess of \$1,000

- Table figures are interim as of May 2021 (rebates from 2018 still being processed)

### Whitby

- Updated rebate formula for 2022 Municipal Election:

Total Contribution	Rebate
\$25 – \$100	75% of contribution
\$100.01 and over	\$75 + 25% of contribution amount in excess of \$100.00

- Updated max. rebate for 2022 Municipal Election: \$200.00
