#### 4. Discussion Item(s)

# 4.1 Wallace Park Redevelopment

David Sun, Landscape Architect, introduced the town's consulting team to further develop the preferred concept plan for the redevelopment of Wallace Park led by Marianne Mokrycke, OMC Landscape Architecture, and Michael Biljetina, ATA Architects Inc.

Staff and the consulting team reported on the Wallace Park redevelopment as provided in the PowerPoint presentation.

Mr. Sun advised that a preferred concept plan for the park was developed by the MBTW Group in consultation with local residents and Councillors in 2018, and the project went into detailed design after the 2020 budget was approved by Council. Mr. Sun asked for the committee's feedback on the proposed accessibility features before moving further into the second design phase.

Marianne Mokrycke presented on the park component, including concept plan, landscape features, and key accessibility features of the park.

Michael Biljetina presented on the accessibility features of the building illustrating the proposed renderings, and the new washroom facility and features.

The committee provided the following comments for consideration:

- ensure that the sink levels in the washroom are accessible to people in wheelchairs;
- consider the materials, such as stone brick versus metal to be used on the outside of the building and environmental benefit;
- consider accessibility and various options, such as a splashpad given the close proximity of Trafalgar Park and playgrounds located about 200 metres away; and

 consider asking parents with children in wheelchairs or blind about accessibility and user friendly playground, and invite and approach parents on the design.

Staff responded to questions regarding the park redevelopment, advising of the following:

- the playground that was installed last year at the new Trafalgar Park
   Community Centres is different and non-traditional with architectural
   vertical elements and fitness for adults, and the playground at Wallace
   Park is more traditional and suited for children and adults;
- specific parents or user groups have not been targeted beyond contact in the neighbourhood, following the standard and components included without getting into specifics,
- staff welcome detailed comments on the park redevelopment and will address particular needs when they can; and
- larger community park locations have a higher level accessibility component including rubber, this neighbourhood park is a scaled down version with the elements proposed.

The architect responded to questions regarding the park redevelopment, advising of the following:

- the sink levels in the washroom are accessible to universal standards with clear space below that conforms to AODA and town standards; and
- the material supply and brick fabrication to be used on the outside of the building, and that the recommendation on the brick veneer colour will be decided later.

Peggy Anne Gordon transferred the Chair to Deborah Muldoon in order to speak to this item.

Peggy Anne Gordon resumed the Chair.

The committee was pleased with the accessibility features of the park redevelopment, indicating that Wallace Park looks wonderful, defines paths and spaces for wheelchair and walker access, and the various park options that are available in the neighbourhood.
