- Joshua Creek Public School was ranked the number 2 at the SUSI ranking in 2020
- Iroquois Ridge has consistently scored highly in the Fraser Institute's annual ranking. This year's score was 8.9 out of a possible 10, and the school was ranked 10 out of 739 high schools in the province of Ontario in 2021

In addition, due to the best schools at my residential area, the residential properties are always more valuable properties.

I DO NOT want to change the current situation whatever at school resource or properties' values.

Thank you for your email.

I am happy to further discuss the rezoning application that has been submitted by the school board. The new school is proposed north of Dundas Street and will accommodate students from the new residential development in that area.

It might not have been clear in the notice, but the school is already zoned for a public school and funding has been secured. The school board wants to modify the existing regulations for the proposed school.

Hi Aliyana. Thank you for your email. The Halton District School Board is the public agency responsible for building new schools and establishing school boundaries. The notice you received in the mail is to notify the community that a Zoning By-law Amendment has been proposed to permit the construction of the proposed school (Oakville NE #3) as required by the Town of Oakville. Please visit our webpage for more information on the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment ([link](#)).

The proposed opening date for Oakville NE #3 is for the 2023/2024 school year. Traditionally, a school boundary review starts approximately one year before the opening of an elementary school. So we hope to start the review Fall/Winter 2022 at the earliest. If you currently have children registered in the HDSB, you will be receiving a notice from the school board when the review is initiated. Information and updates will be posted on our website once the review begins.
