


- Cultural Heritage Evaluation Report (CHER) completed by heritage consultant SMDA
- Notice of intention to demolish submitted with CHER




FRONT ELEVATION



REAR ELEVATION








Heritage assessment

CHER assessment

- Design/physical value
 - House retains some of its original cottage but has been heavily altered and no longer is representative example of this style.
 - Does not display a high degree of craftsmanship or artistic merit
 - Does not display a high degree of technical or scientific achievement

Historical/associative value

- Associations with George C. Atkins, the publisher of the Oakville Record-Star and long time school board trustee
- Does not have potential to yield significant information about a community
- Is not associated with a significant architect, artist, builder, designer or theorist

Contextual value

- Only loosely historically linked to the Orchard Beach/Park development
- Not important in defining, maintaining or supporting the area, which has been in flux for many years.
- Not a landmark



Staff recommendation:

- 1. That the property at 530 Carson Lane be removed from the Oakville Register of Properties of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest; and,
- 2. That, prior to demolition, the property owner allow for the salvage of materials from the house.
