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Project Overview

- Introduction
- Prepared mandatory Community Risk Assessment (CRA) required Ontario Regulation 378/18 (new).
- New CRA legislation requires municipalities utilize their completed CRA to "inform all decisions" related to the delivery of fire protection services (FPS) within their community. Foundational and specific to each municipality for risk, growth, & emerging issues.
- CRA findings have been utilized to inform the proposed Fire Master Plan (FMP). Multi-year strategic framework for the delivery of fire protection services.
- Plan includes **Recommendations** based upon Fire Strategic Goals, CRA compliance and aligns with **Council Strategic Priorities.**



Project Scope - Fire Master Plan

- Comprehensive evaluation of all current fire services through divisional reviews.
- Compared to legislated requirements and municipal best practices.
- Proactively prepare for future growth and recommendations for actual & realized growth.
- Provide supporting documentation to inform the CPSE accreditation process.
- Comprehensive and broad internal and external stakeholder engagement program.





FMP- High Level

- Continuous improvements to maintain levels of service amidst planned & realized growth.
- Compliance for current and forecasted legislation& standards requirements.
- Achieve fire strategic goals through recommendations and guiding principles from FMP process.
- FMP process has historically been well received & accepted in Oakville and 2024 plan is even more comprehensive.

- Identify proposed service levels for:
 - Community Fire Safety and Risk-Reduction
 - Fire Suppression
 - Provide recommendations for implementation of FMP following Council's approval






Guiding Legislation

- Fire Protection and Prevention Act 1997 (FPPA):
 - Municipal Responsibilities.
 - Fire Chief's Responsibility to Council.
 - New Ontario Regulation 387/18 Community Risk Assessments.
 - New Ontario Regulation 343/22 Firefighter Certification.
- Ontario Health and Safety Act
 - Section 21 Guidance Notes (fire service).
- Ontario Fire Code
 - Code Enforcement, Smoke Alarms, Fire suppression systems, etc.



Guiding Legislation (New)

- Ontario Regulation 378/18: Community
 Risk Assessments requires all municipalities
 in Ontario to:
 - develop a CRA.
 - use the CRA to "inform decisions about the provision of fire protection services".
 - Review the CRA annually and update it every five years or as needed.
 - Came into effect under FPPA July 1st,
 2019 Municipal Compliance July 1, 2024.





Industry Best Practices & Standards

- **OFM guidelines** (Public Fire Safety Guidelines, Technical Guidelines, Communiques, etc.).
- OFM's Three Lines of Defence model.
- NFPA Standards (e.g. NFPA 1710, 1730, 1221, 1300, 1500 etc.)
- **CPSE CFAI Accreditation** (Continuous Improvement; Standards of Cover and Risk Assessment).
- Technical Reports (e.g. National Institute of Standards and Technology)
- Fire Underwriters Survey.
- Municipal best practices.
















Existing Conditions Initial Arriving Apparatus




Existing Conditions – Initial Full Alarm Assignment

Next Steps & Recommendations

- •That Council approve the 2024 Fire Master Plan;
- •That Council receive the Community Risk Assessment;
- •That Council direct the Fire Chief to use the 2024 Fire Master Plan as a reference document to support the delivery of Fire Protection Services over the next 10 years (2024-2033);
- •That the financial investments recommended within the 2024 FMP inform the ten year capital forecast based on prioritization of funding and growth forecasts as part of the long-term community investment plan. All recommendations with financial considerations are reviewed during the annual budget process.
