Denser communities lead to reduced resource utilisation and would help in reducing severity of the ongoing Climate Crisis

We need to take action-

Denser housing not only reduces resource utilisation in it's construction, but also leads to less waste of resources over time in reducing transit, reducing electricity and water usage per person.

Dense Housing is the Future

Many municipalities around Oakville have already embraced 4 as of right and the housing crisis is something both homeowners and renters in Oakville are suffering from.

If we want to prepare Oakville for the future and maintain our city as the affordable, vibrant community it is, we need to take steps to encourage more dense housing construction and reduce the amount residents spend on housing each month.

Oakville is not even in the Top 30 most populated municipalities in Canada but still has the 5th most expensive rent prices.
