- Staff last reported to Council in August 2023
- FCM conference starting June 6, AMO conference in August
- Requests align with town's vision and strategic priorities

Key Changes to Requests

- Reviewed and updated requests:
 - Auto Industry to align with Ontario Auto Mayors priorities, address auto theft
 - Midtown Oakville to remove request related to the reconstruction of the Trafalgar Road interchange, allow better access to the eastern portion of Midtown
 - Financial Tools renamed to Social and Economic Prosperity Review, to align with AMO



Key Changes to Requests (continued)

- Reviewed and updated requests:
 - Transit renamed to Community Infrastructure Provincial Funding for Transit Projects and to Alleviate Congestion and provide clarity on Hwy.
 403 widening
 - Green Buildings to request updates to the Ontario Building Code, (including lowering home ownership costs, drainage issues in basements and residential sprinklers)
 - Kerr Street Grade Separation to align with OnCorridor expansion.



New and Removed Requests

- New requests:
 - Small gas-powered equipment and consideration of a ban
 - Implementation of Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA)

- Removed requests:
 - Digital Infrastructure
 - Greenbelt
 - Display of Objectionable Images



Conclusion and Recommendation

- Requests will continue to help direct future actions and strengthen partnerships with all governments.
- The list will continue to be refined and reviewed on an ongoing basis.
- Briefs will be uploaded to the Council portal.
