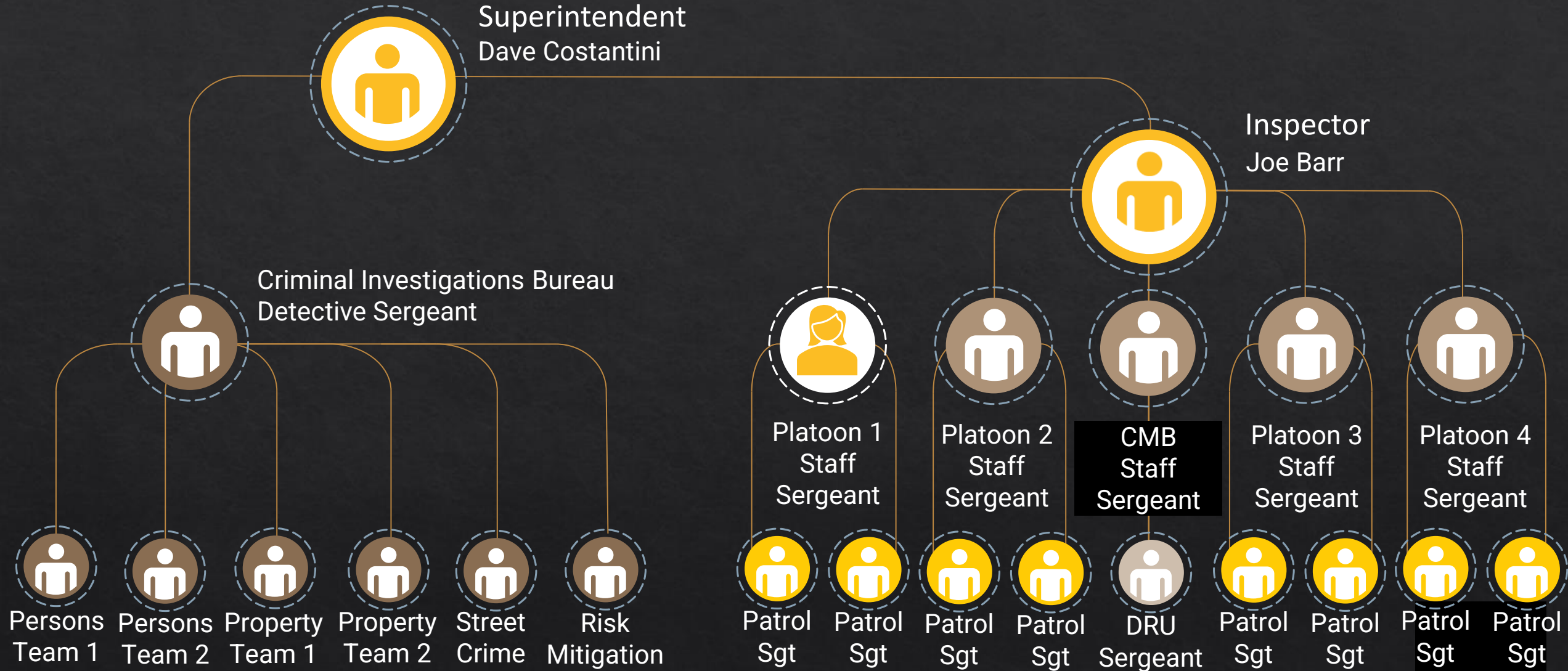

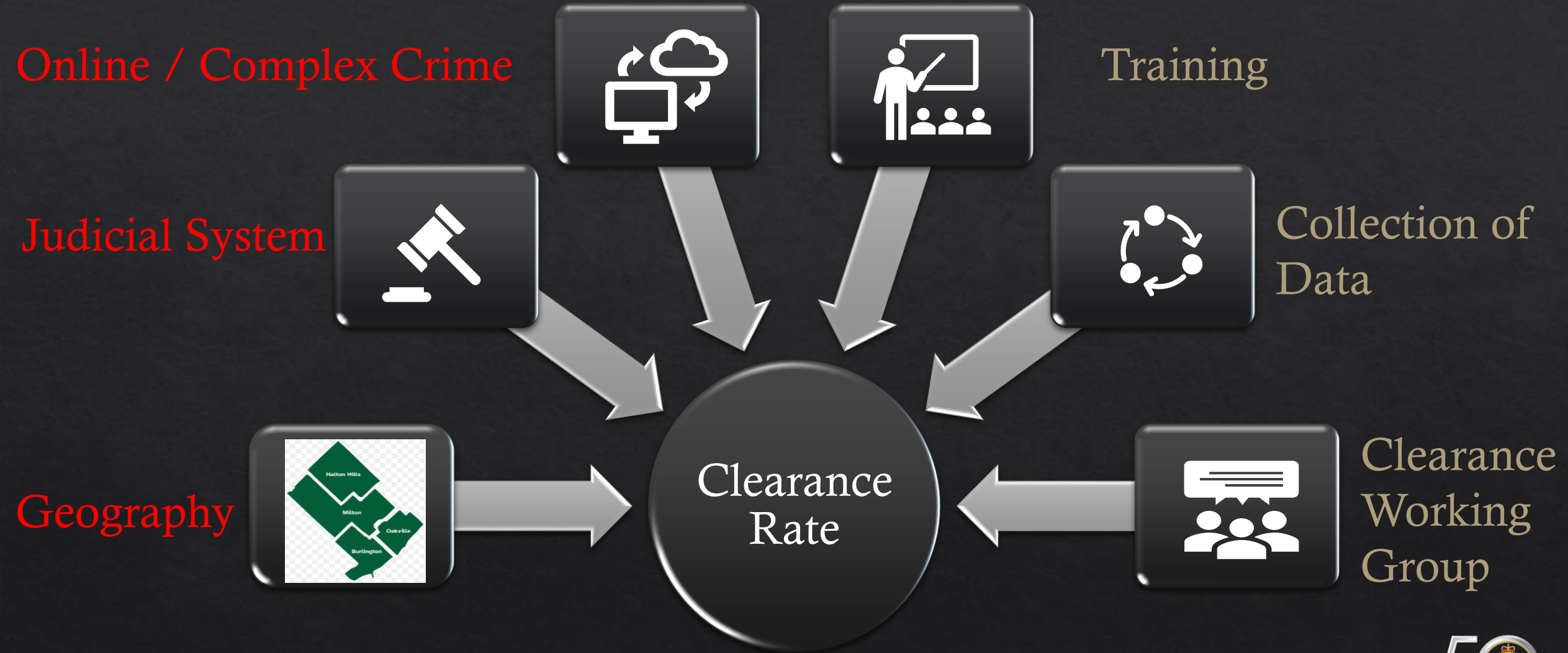

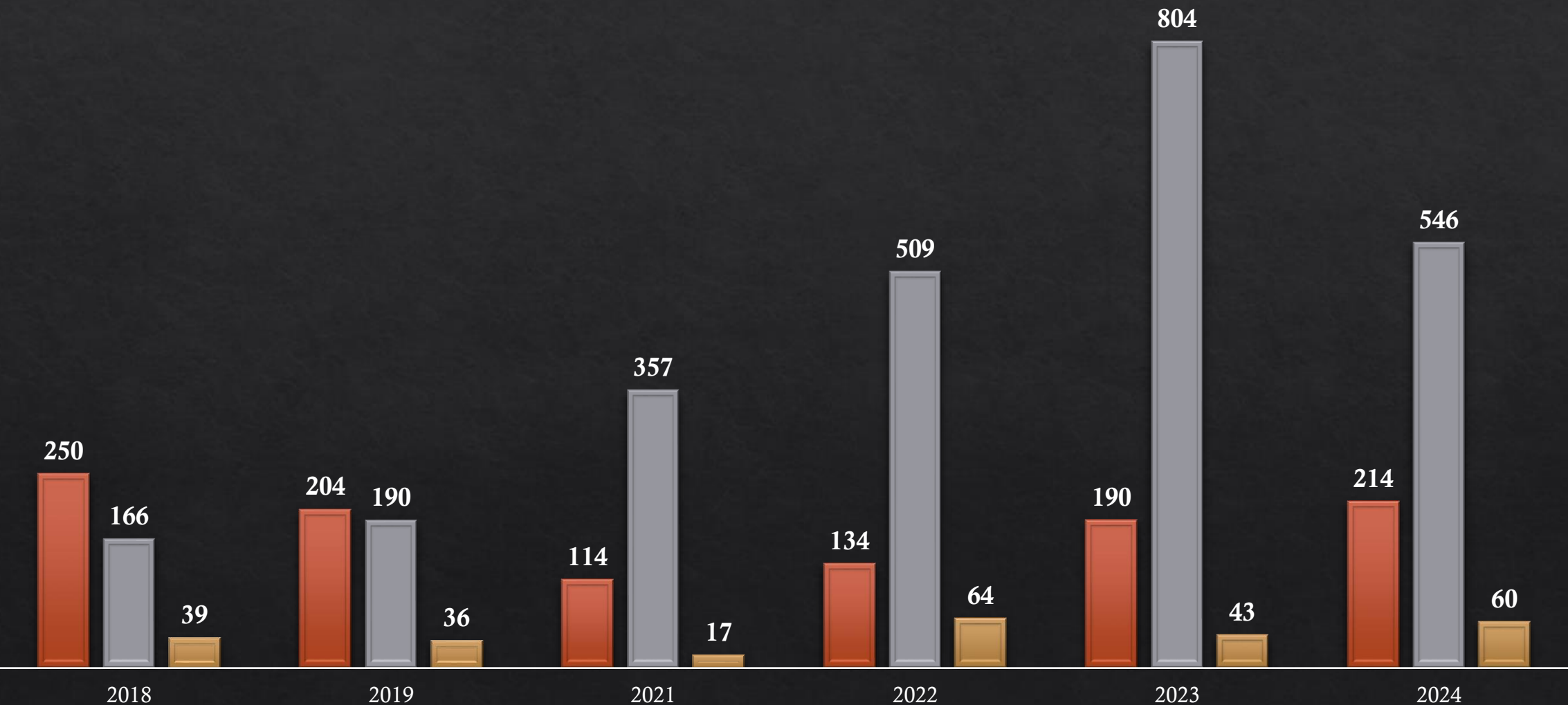

## Oakville – Residential Break and Enter Statistics

Period Covering: January 1, 2024 – December 16, 2024



**OVERVIEW:** From January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024, **212** Residential B&Es have been reported within the Town of Oakville. The criminals frequently targeted high-value items such as jewelry/watches, cash, luxury handbags, and car keys.

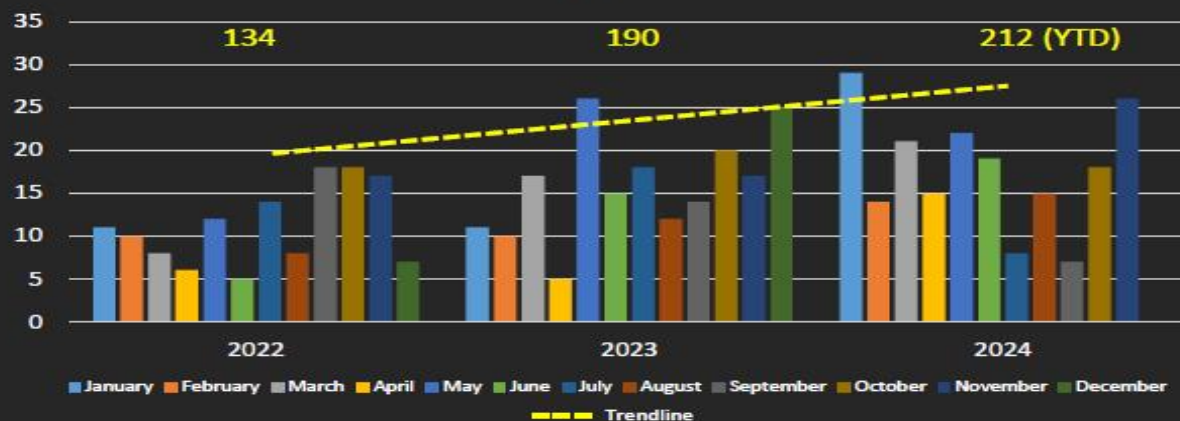
### Method of Entry:

- 42% were due to smashing/forcing entry through the rear patio door
- 21% were by smashing/forcing entry through the front door
- 20% were by insecure doors/windows
- 13% were by smashing/forcing entry through a window
- 4% were by other/undetermined method (garage, side door, etc.)

→ ~22% of the reported incidents were Attempt Only

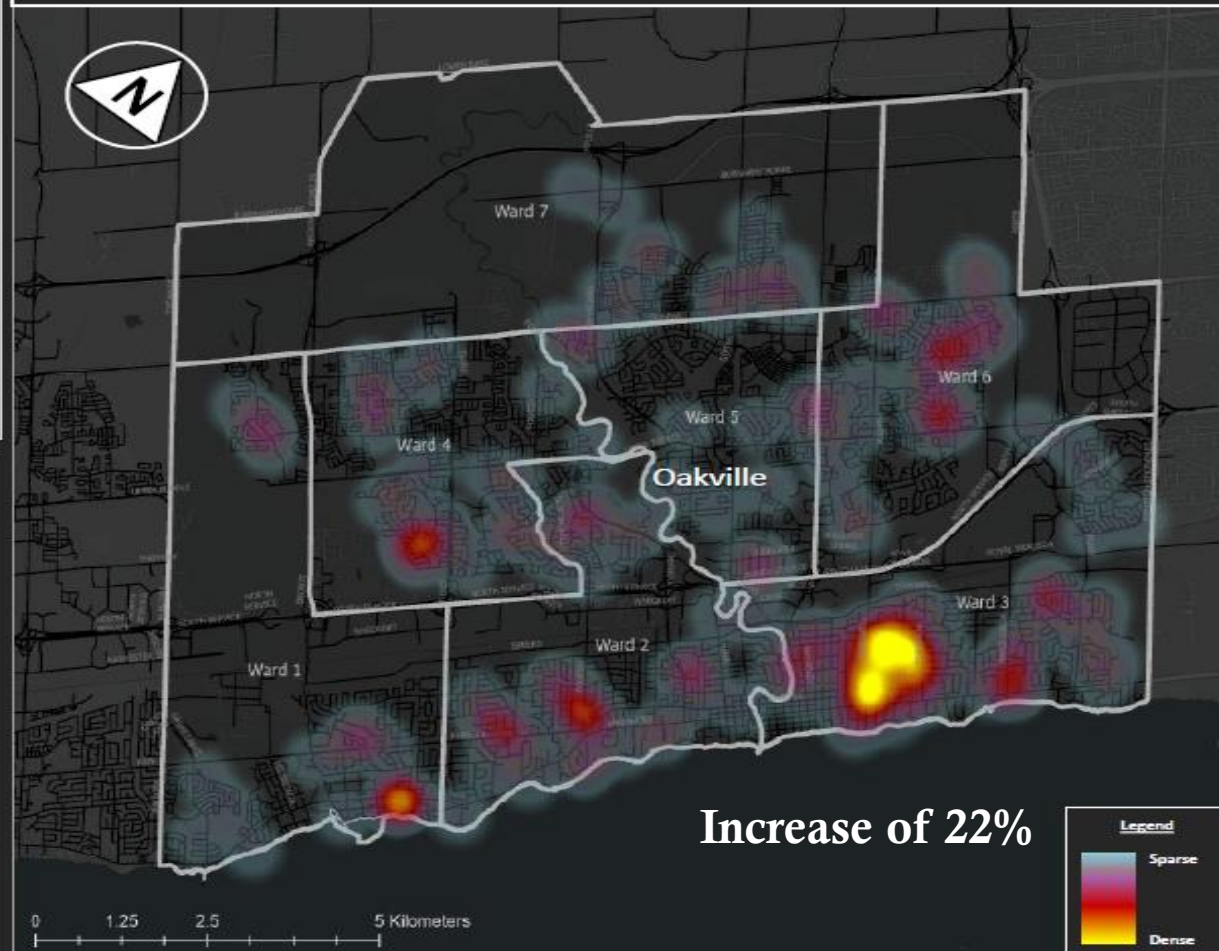
→ 42 of the reported incidents had a confirmed or probable Auto Theft-related motive

## Oakville – Theft of Vehicle Statistics

Period Covering: January 1, 2024 – December 16, 2024



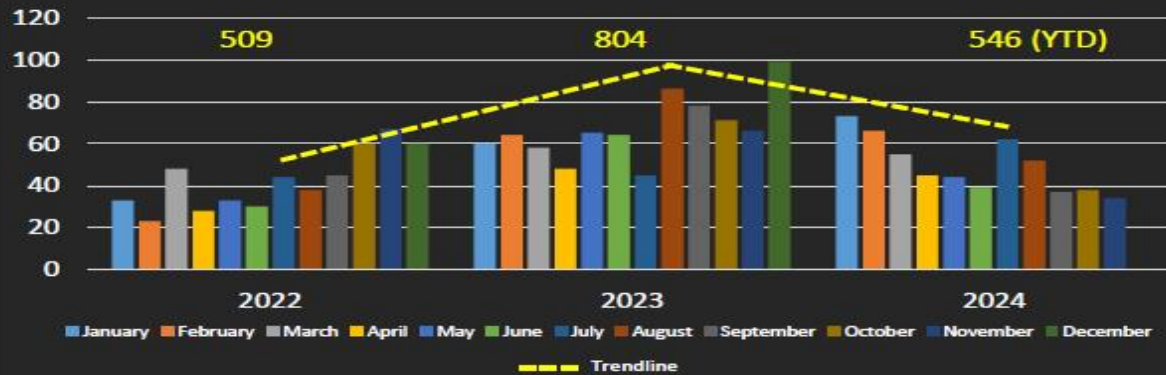
**OVERVIEW:** From January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024, **546** Vehicle Thefts have been reported within the Town of Oakville.

- **70%** were in residential areas
- **28%** were in commercial areas
- **2%** were in other areas (public parking/streets/roadways)

### Modus Operandi:

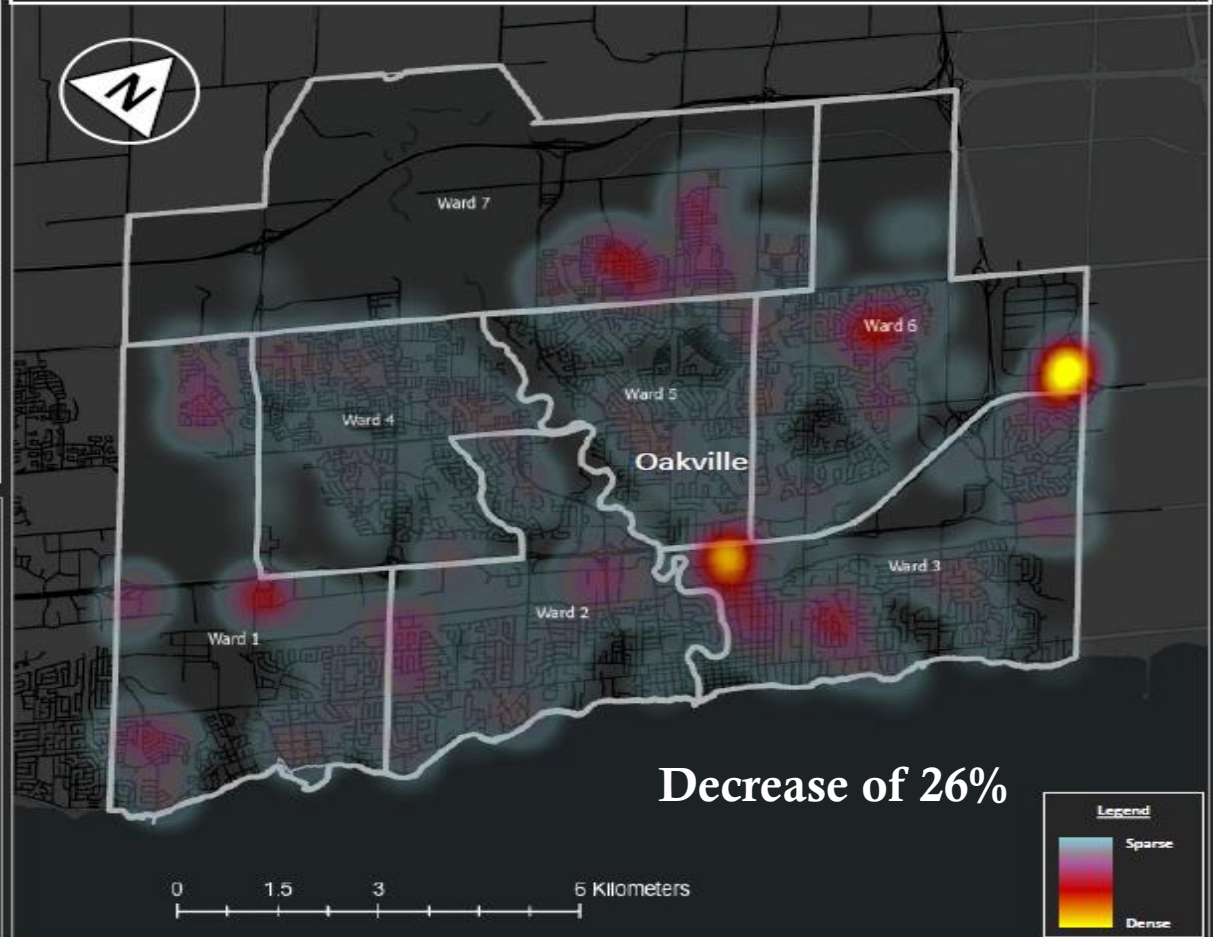
- **59%** were Keyless thefts (Reprogramming, CAN Bus, Relay)
- **6%** were thefts using Stolen Keys
- **7%** were thefts by Force/Without consent/Opportunistic (Keys-in, Test drive, etc.)
- **~18%** were Attempt Only (almost all Keyless)
- Majority of vehicle thefts occurred overnight

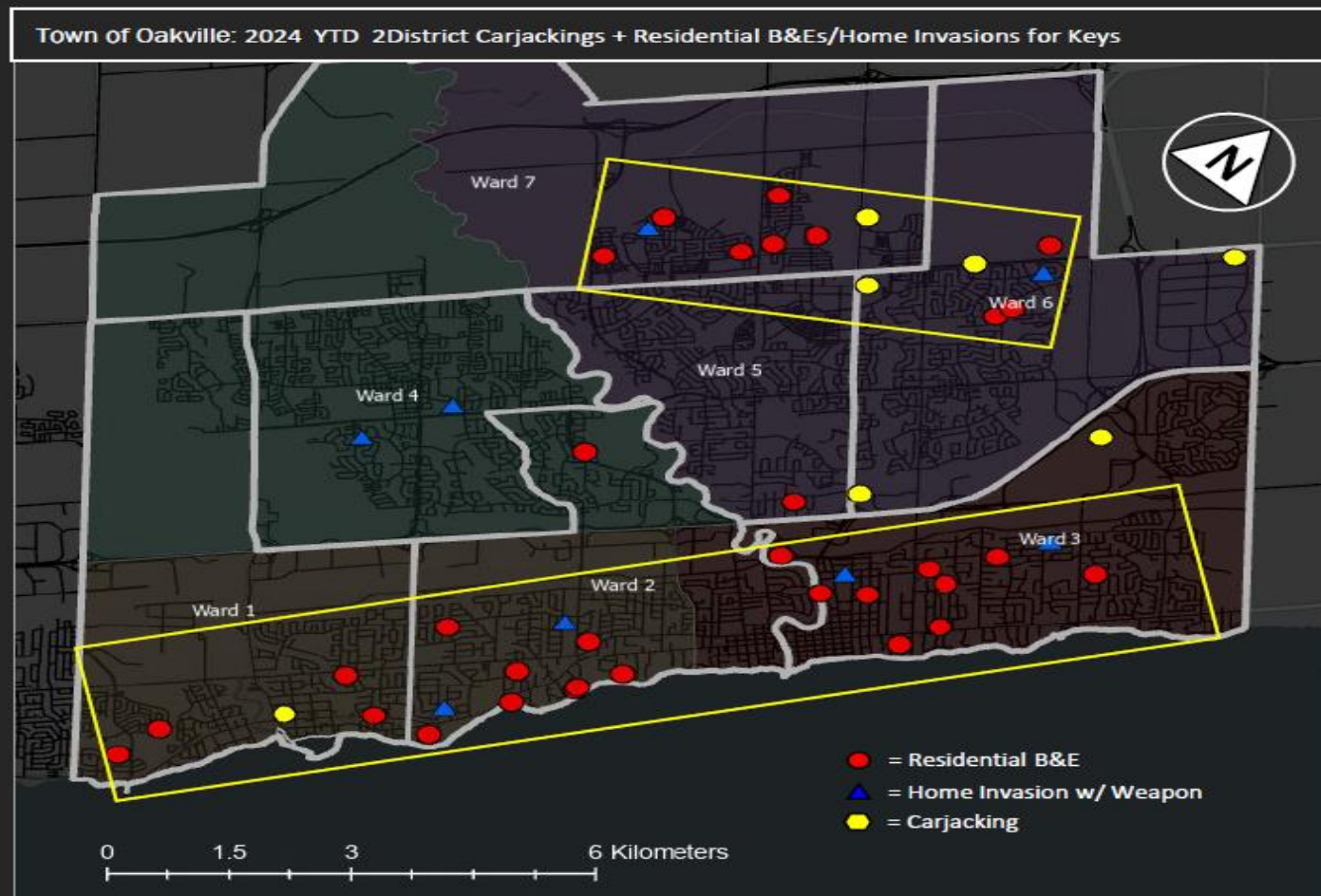
## Oakville Year-to-Date Residential B&Es/ Home Invasions for Keys

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**OVERVIEW:** From January 1, 2024 – December 16, 2024, Oakville has had a total of **42** B&Es/Home Invasions with either a confirmed or probable auto-related motive.

- Notably, most of the victims had a premium model **MERCEDES SUV** in the driveway
  - Particularly the **G-Wagon**
  - Maybach, GLS, GLE models have been targeted as well
- 9 Occurrences involved confronting residents with weapons (handgun or hammer)
- Almost all incidents occurred **overnight during early morning hours** (1am – 4am)

In addition, **6** Carjackings have been reported within Oakville during this period.

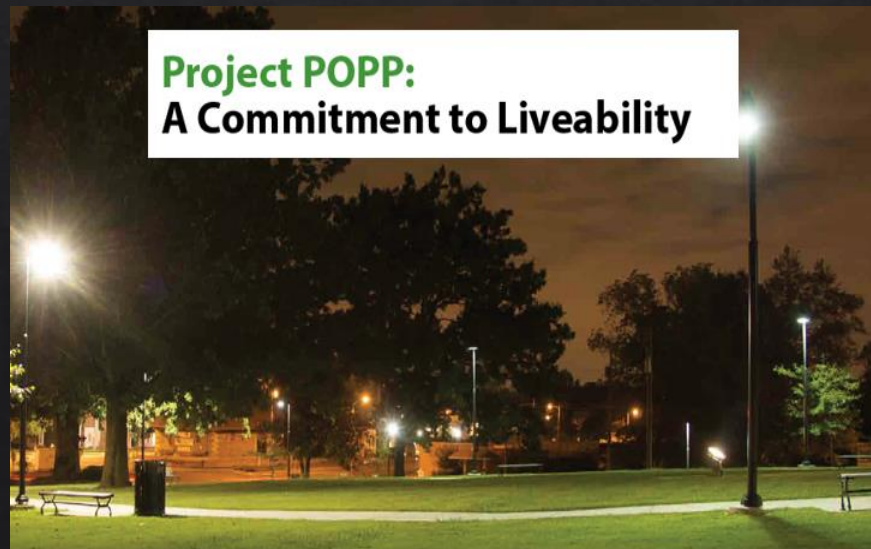

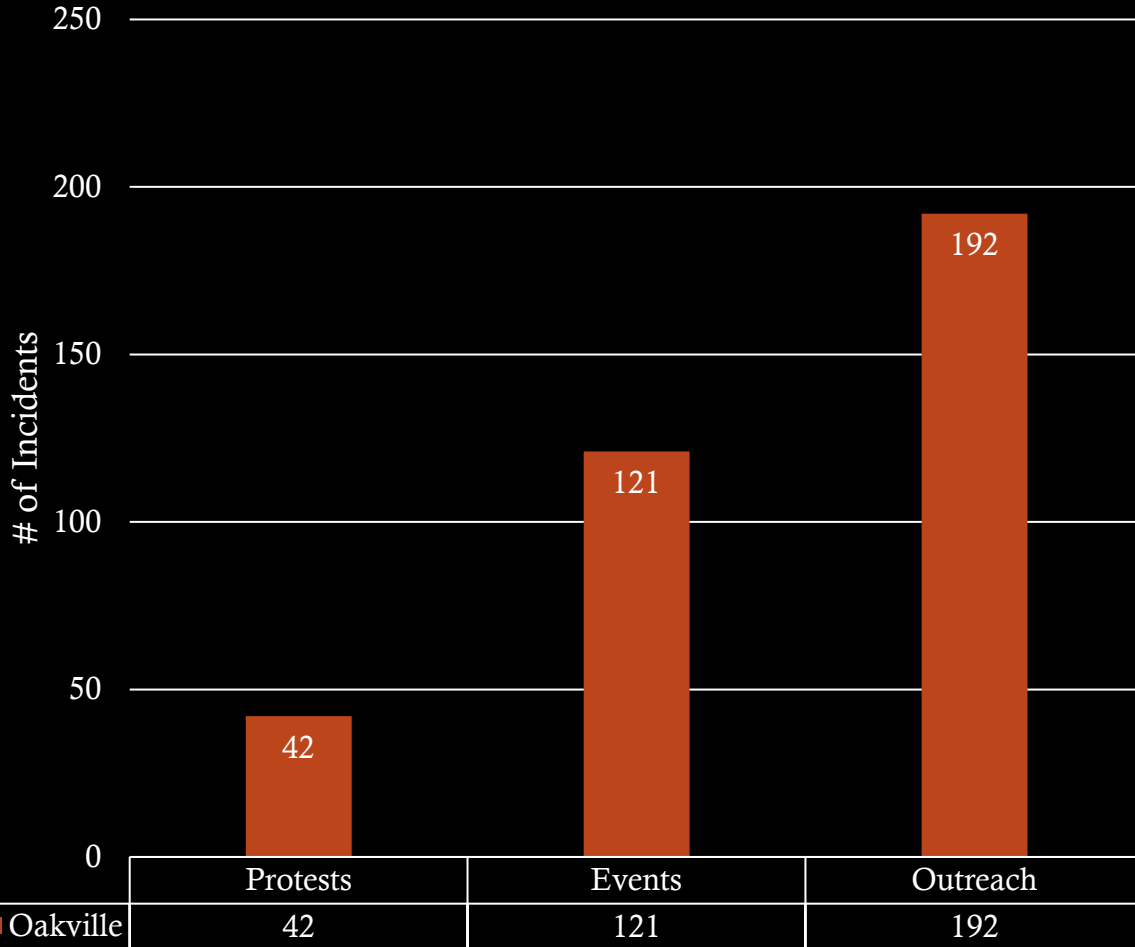

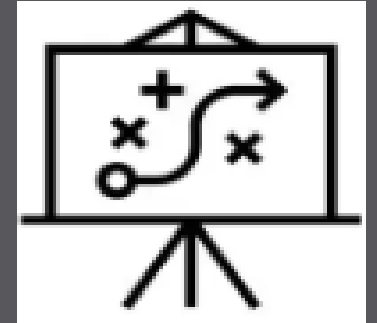
