# 10.2 Midtown TOC Development Proposal 01/27/25





#### 1.) Density

It currently represents an **excessive and disproportionate** amount of the total **planned population** for Midtown.

The TOC density of development is beyond the Town's draft OPA allocation and is not justified.





#### 2. Land Uses

## The TOC proposal risks becoming the benchmark for future development of other sites Midtown.

#### This has significant implications on future infrastructure, (potentially exceeds planned future capacity for all of Midtown).





#### 3. Built Form

# Due to excessive and disproportionate density of the proposal, the resulting tower heights are also excessive.

The TOC risks Midtown's evolution into a complete community





#### 4. Community Benefits

Community benefits are not in line with Oakville's existing or draft policies.

The TOC proposal relies heavily on others to provide the majority of the ingredients necessary for a complete community.





#### 5. Transportation

Current studies are insufficient to support the proposal.

The TOC proposal needs to identify adequate plans for efficient bus, transit, cycling and walking systems that support the proposed level of development.





#### In Conclusion,

#### The TOC is not aligned with the recent Midtown OPA.

### The TOC proposal does not implement proposed policies regarding maximum density, ratio of residents to jobs.....
