- a. Heritage Permit Application HP050/19-42.20B

 191 Burnhamthorpe Road East Salvage, Reconstruction
 and Relocation of Connected Barn
 - Report from Planning Services Department, November 20, 2019

Moved by Councillor Gittings

- That Heritage Permit Application HP050/19-42.20B for the dismantling, storage and reconstruction of the connected barn at 191 Burnhamthorpe Road East, as attached in Appendix B to the report dated November 20, 2019 from Planning Services, be approved subject to the following:
 - a. That the property owner enters into a heritage easement agreement (including the provision of securities) with the Town prior to the dismantling of the connected barn in order to ensure the long-term conservation of the heritage building;
 - b. That a Conservation Plan, including dismantling and salvage, storage and reconstruction details, for a Built Heritage Resource be approved by Heritage Planning staff and included in the heritage easement agreement; and
 - c. That the Town Solicitor be authorized to discharge the heritage easement agreement from title, at the expense of the owner, once the requirements in the agreement have been satisfied to the satisfaction of the Manager of Policy Planning and Heritage; and
- 2. That this heritage permit expire four years from the date of final approval by Council.

e. <u>Cultural Heritage Landscape Strategy - Phase Two Oakville</u> Harbour

 Report from Planning Services Department, November 20, 2019

Susan Schappert, Heritage Planner, and Ellen Kowalchuk, Common Bond Collective, town consultant, made a PowerPoint presentation on the cultural heritage landscape strategy for the Oakville Harbour.

The committee requested confirmation that adaptive reuse options for the harbour, which could include new commercial uses, would still be permitted under a cultural heritage landscape designation. Staff advised that, given the range of existing and historic uses of the harbour, a cultural heritage landscape designation should not preclude new uses that are sympathetic and compatible, and that this could be looked at as part of the Harbours Master Plan.
